

## What is a safety event reporting and management system?

A safety event reporting and management system collects detailed safety event data for analysis, response deployment and success measurement, and provides a tool for accounting for the cost savings realized by interventions.

## Why use one?

A non-punitive event reporting program is essential to a positive safety culture and to maintain constant safety awareness in a company. It has been estimated that for each fatal accident, as many as 360 incidents occur. Proper investigation of reported incidents or “near misses” provides an opportunity to identify and correct underlying problems before an accident occurs.

Safety event reporting and management systems:

- Promote a healthy, non-blame safety culture
- Enable safety improvement
- Standardize event logging
- Build staff confidence
- Encourage reporting
- Boost safety office productivity
- Identify the impact of human factors on safety

# AVSiS is the one

AVSiS, the Aviation Safety Information System, is a powerful tool to collect and analyze safety information for the on-demand air charter industry and shared aircraft ownership programs because:

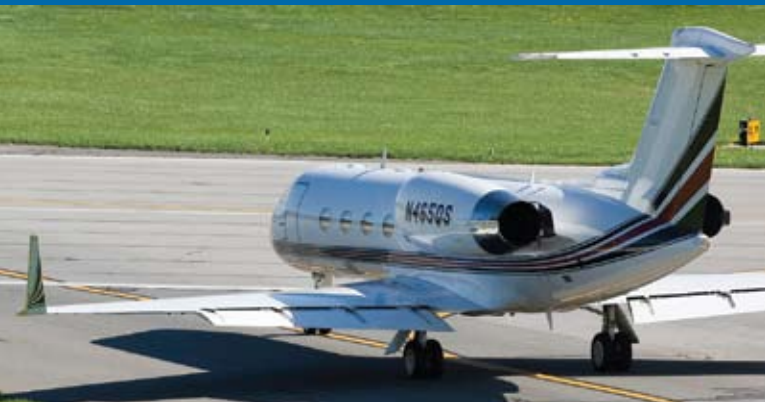
- Pilots, line employees, maintenance staff and all other employees are empowered through AVSiS to report safety information to the company safety manager for development of mitigation and intervention strategies.
- AVSiS logs safety events as incidents (events with a direct safety implication) or occurrences (events which may have resulted in an incident).
- AVSiS enables the user to categorize the event and apply a severity rating (important for Safety Management System programs).
- AVSiS tracks event investigations and flags overdue items. The safety manager may make recommendations and monitor implementation.
- AVSiS provides statistical reports and graphical trend analyses by incident type, aircraft model location, or other specified field. The AVSiS Query Builder is a flexible tool to find the records you require.

## How to Obtain AVSiS

To encourage the wide-spread use of this safety-enhancing tool, ACSF is making the program available to all Part 135 on-demand operators and Part 91K fractional program managers at *no charge*.
